Re: Uniforms

Uniforms have been an ongoing issue in the Tuesday Night Competition. SCNA has always sought to provide a competition that is of the highest of standards and is professionally run for our members to enjoy. So in the interests of players' comfort, spectators and officials, it is of utmost importance that the uniform guidelines are adhered to by all clubs.

In recent times we have had the arduous task of having to police these uniform standards, specifically the lengths, whilst some teams have been fantastic and have rectified this issue others have been very slow to comply with our requests.

As season 1 for the Tuesday night competition 2015 is beginning, we are hereby giving all teams due warning, to comply with the uniform standards. When the competition resumes, if players are wearing uniforms that are too short, they will be unable to take the court in the SCNA Tuesday night competition, until this has been corrected.

The constitution clearly states, these rules are printed at the front of the draw:

No player should have underwear visible at any time whilst walking or standing. This includes any type of underwear under the hem line. Bike pants, Bummers, Skins or sports pants should not be seen in a standing or walking position.

Players will be asked to leave the court in 2015 if this happens.

Orders may need to be placed now so that new uniforms will be available in time for the new season in 2015.

Players waiting on new uniforms need to wear a skirt underneath their current uniform so that they are in appropriately covering clothing. Wearing a uniform that is too short is considered, out of uniform and it is not appropriate. These players will be deemed out of uniform, so uniform exemptions do need to be requested for the remainder of this season. Failure to do so, in the first instance, will incur a 4-goal penalty; following this player will be unable to take the court.

We look forward to seeing you all looking fresh and smart in your new uniforms for 2015.
